THE WINNERS ARE... PETER RICCI & SUZANNE GULKA!

Peter & Suzanne have won a \$15 gift certificate from Tim Hortons! Read on to learn about their catch...



Their Story:

Peter and Suzanne recently averted inappropriate therapy with amphotericin B deoxycholate (Fungizone) when amphotericin B lipid complex (Abelcet) was the appropriate formulation. Peter, in discussion with Suzanne, reviewed the patient's profile against written orders from the previous night pharmacy call-back and understanding the patient's condition, caught the order entry mix-up before the inappropriate formulation was prepared and administered.

The lipid formulation was prepared and administered to the patient the previous night, which was the intended order, but the pharmacist that selected the "amphotericin B" pre-defined order entry code (PDO) was unaware that the code was actually intended for the conventional deoxycholate form (Fungizone) and not the lipid complex form (Abelcet).

When lipid amphotericin B (Abelcet) is used, it is usually to help reduce the side effects of the conventional amphotericin B deoxycholate (Fungizone). This patient was already on dialysis and very critically ill. If not for Peter and Suzanne's crucial catch and the amphotericin B deoxycholate (Fungizone) had made it through the manufacturing process and was administered to the patient that subsequent night based on what was entered in the pharmacy



system, it could have led to a significant overdose and potential patient harm!

Work was done to ensure that everyone knew about the potential for this mistake to happen at our sites and an aid was devised to prevent future recurrences (a PDO specific Drug warning alert). Everyone is encouraged to review the ISMP recommendations regarding all "amphotericin B" orders and consider implementing their recommendations by checking out the following links:

SCP Representative Report

The Saskatchewan College of Pharmacists (SCP) <http://saskpharm.ca> has been busy with many regulatory issues affecting the profession over the last several months.

In the spring, SCP participated in a workshop along with the Saskatchewan Registered Nurses Association (SRNA) and the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan (CPSS). At the workshop, ideas were generated for how the three organizations could work together to improve service to the public of the province. A few of the principles with common purpose will be pursued by the regulatory bodies in the future.

This spring also saw the InterD4 conference held in conjunction with SRNA and CPSS. Unfortunately, the attendance from pharmacists was lower than in previous years. The workshop format led multidisciplinary teams through many of the phases necessary for effective teamwork, and had many local ideas fleshed out.

SCP continues to dialogue as well with other key stakeholders with regards to pharmacy practice in the province, including CSHP-Sk Branch. Current issues include ongoing evaluation of prescribing by pharmacists, regulation of pharmacy technicians, and reviewing the appropriateness of our current scope of practice in areas such as ordering lab tests and administration of parenteral medications and vaccines. SCP is part of

the Interdisciplinary Advisory Committee on Prescriptive Authority which was formed to collaboratively address issues around pharmacist prescribing. This group will continue discussing the expansion of the number of medical conditions eligible for minor ailments prescribing, and to confirm the circumstances and training requirements for Level II prescribing without a collaborative practice agreement.

SCP is involved, along with CSHP-Sk Branch and other groups, in the provincial Pharmacy Practice Change Working Group. The SCP council is examining a commitment to pharmacists' roles as experts in medication therapy management, and not a "buffet line" of picking and choosing the activities that are provided to patients. Members within our profession will need to receive communication to help with preparation for practice change, and the ability to provide feedback and endorsement to keep the profession moving. SCP's role is to govern based on patient care and practice responsibility; not on payment models.

SCP continues to collaborate with colleagues in Alberta and British Columbia, as part of the western economic partnership. This synergy will provide for greater efficiency among the three regulatory bodies: for example, common data definitions and performance measures for use in practice reviews are being developed. www.international.alberta.ca/documents/WesternEconomicPartnership.pdf

In August, SCP hosted the annual meeting of Division V of the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) and the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy. Saskatchewan and Manitoba's regulatory bodies belong to Division V, and gain a broad understanding of pharmacy issues in the United States. This was the first time that a NABP Division meeting was hosted in Saskatchewan, and very positive feedback was received. Several CSHP-Sk Branch members were involved with the organization and presentations. At the annual meeting, a resolution was passed that Division V encourage multiple accreditation and licensing bodies "to continue discussions and study opportunities to facilitate reciprocity of licensure between Canada and the United States." www.nodakpharmacy.com/pdfs/11Agenda.pdf

SCP continues to be involved in several ongoing issues. We are supportive and active within primary health care redesign, and the need to enable patients to self-manage their chronic diseases. SCP was one of the first bodies to formally ask for action about the ongoing issue of pharmaceutical shortages, and are pleased that a national plan to address this issue is being developed and communicated to manufacturers.

Finally, the strategic plan for SCP expires at the end of this calendar year, and a new plan will be developed in the near future.

Meet the Members

Christie Matechuk, BSP

Where do you work and what do you do?

I've been a staff pharmacist in the Regina Qu'Appelle Health Region for exactly 1 year now and have a variety of sites under my hat. The Pasqua hospital remains my home site where I work the general medicine and surgery wards. I also am involved in long-term care at the Wascana Rehabilitation Center where, as a clinical pharmacist, I take an intense role in medication reconciliation as well as inter-professional patient conferences year round. A third specialty I take part in is the Anticoagulation Management Service. This is a clinic where we are responsible for managing the needs of ~200 patients in regards to anticoagulation. Specifically, we deal with warfarin for the vast majority of our patients, but aid in the implementation of LMWH's for bridging purposes as well.

What do you find most rewarding about your particular job?

As I am involved in many aspects of healthcare, the most rewarding part of my day is educating a patient or other health care professional on the simple things. If I can educate one person a day for the better, then I've done my job. A perfect example of this would be to ensure my warfarin patients know that an INR blood test does not require fasting. Or if a nurse asks me the difference between 2 antibiotics and why the patient would require both, I can go home feeling good about my day.

What are the challenges in your practice?

One of the hugest challenges in my practice is to make our role as professionals known. It still shocks and amazes me how little recognition hospital pharmacists receive in the public eye, much less in the health care community. Majority of people are not even aware that there are pharmacists in the hospital, and are even less educated about our role in in-patient care. A hospital could not function for 30 minutes without pharmacists, much less on a day to day basis. It has been surveyed that pharmacists are the most TRUSTED health care professional by the public. We owe it to ourselves to own this recognition and respect!

Fun fact for the day is that I am the HUGEST STAR WARS fan around. My sister and I have been obsessed with the saga since we were young girls, and the legacy lives on today.
